
Registration and Certification




Executive Council and Organizational Structure

- **3. Youth for Care** Engaging youth to Channel their eneriges in Supporting the needy widows orphans and the poor Society
- **4. Department of Finance (DOF):** Ensuring transparent and efficient financial management.
- **5. Department of Human Resources Management (DHR):** Building a skilled and motivated team.
- 6. Department of Humanitarian Assistance: Delivering swift aid and rehabilitation during crises.
- **7. Department of Social Media and Publications (DSMP):** Amplifying our mission through impactful communication.
- **8. Department of Education (DE):** Providing quality education and vocational and other trainings.
- **9. Department of Islamic Education and Tarbiyah (DIET):** Fostering moral and spiritual development.

This strategic redesign positions Al Islah Center to continue its mission with greater efficiency, ensuring that we empower children and communities to thrive and lead with integrity.



Department of Education

The Department of Education at Al Islah Center is dedicated to providing a holistic learning environment for children, nurturing their academic, moral, and personal growth. The school sections include Administration, Pre-School, Primary Co-Education, and separate High School sections for boys and girls. Daily routines emphasize instilling ethical values through greetings (Salam o Kalam), teaching basic morals, and engaging students in Hifz and Nazra Quran classes. Alongside these, regular academic activities are conducted to ensure a balanced educational experience.

Monthly and term-wise activities enrich the students' learning journey. The department organizes celebrations for various occasions and festivals, fostering cultural and social awareness. Term-based activities include inter-house competitions, focusing on Quranic recitation, Naat, speeches, patriotic songs, and theatrical performances. These initiatives aim to develop well-rounded individuals who excel academically while embodying strong moral and social values.



Department of Islamic Education and Tarbiyah

Responding to the community's demand for comprehensive Islamic education, Al Islah Center launched Jamia Rehmania, a renowned madrasah offering a comprehensive curriculum from Qaida to Dars-e-Nizami. Recognized by the Government of Pakistan, this initiative broadens our impact, fostering an inclusive approach to community development beyond orphan care. Guided by seasoned religious scholars, the madrasah ensures a daily routine focused on prayer, the teachings of the blessed Hadiths, Quranic recitation, memorization, and understanding, enhancing the spiritual growth of our students.





Auditors' report

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of MARKAZ ISLAH DARUL AYTAM, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at June 30, 2024 and the Income and Expenditures Account and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended, and Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, (or give a true and fair view of) the Balance Sheet of MARKAZ ISLAH DARUL AYTAM as at June 30, 2024 and the Income and Expenditures Account and its cash flows for the year ended and notes to the financial statements in accordance with the approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as applicable in Pakistan. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the MARKAZ ISLAH DARUL AYTAM, in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for professional Accountants as adopted by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan (The code), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management

The management committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan, and for such internal control as the management committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management committee is responsible for assessing the organization's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the organization or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the organization's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.


